# Mount Waverley Water Main Renewal Project

## Rescheduled works - Blackburn Road and High Street Road Intersection closure

We will be conducting barrier movement around our work areas as the project progresses east towards the M22 pipe track (see figure 2).

To safely do this we will have to conduct a full road closure on High Street Road between Lee Avenue and Hunter Street, Mount Waverley. This work needs to be done out of hours when traffic movement is at its' lowest.

**When: Friday 10th May 2024 to Friday 24th May 2024**

**Time: Road closures and detours will be in place for 24 hours during this period**

**Please note - High Street Road will remain open, but lanes will be reduced to single lane around our work area.**

- Noise from construction equipment, construction activities and large vehicles.
- The footpath will remain open with detours.

- Temporary traffic disruption. Please show caution when passing our work zone
- Left turn only at the Blackburn Road and High Street Road intersection.
- Changes to the way you travel. Allow extra travel time during the period. Our recommended detour options are:
  - Springvale Road
  - Highbury Road
  - Waverley Road
  - Blackburn Road
