Mount Waverley water main renewal project

Works on St Albans Street

As part of the final works on the Mount Waverley water main renewal project, we will be repairing a water pipe connection on St Albans Street, Mount Waverley. These works will start on **Wednesday 9 April 2025** and are expected to take 7 days to complete.

What are we doing?

To safely complete these works, we will be closing one traffic lane in front of 60 St Albans Street for one week. We will barrier off this area and excavate down to expose the existing water pipes for repair.

These works will be during daytime hours and traffic management will be present to assist motorists and pedestrians around the work site.

When: Wednesday 9 April to Thursday 17 April 2025 (7 days, weather permitting)

Time: 7am – 5pm (day hours)

What to expect

Noise and vibration: There will be noise from excavation and pipe cutting equipment, as well as asphalting machinery to reinstate the roadway.

Driveway access: No driveways will be impacted. Traffic controllers will be present to assist residents when trucks and machinery are moving around.

Pedestrian access: Footpaths will always remain open. Traffic controllers will be present to assist when machinery is moving around.

Parking closure: To ensure the safety of motorists and bike riders, parking spaces opposite the work area will be closed. This will allow traffic to flow outside of working hours. Please show caution to oncoming vehicles and reduce speed when passing.
