	If the EPA website declares a day of poor, very poor or extremely poor air quality then all ESWEC visits will be cancelled.	
Teacher	Melbourne Water Educators will conduct activities with teachers present.	
supervision	Teachers to always supervise students.	
	 Any accompanying adults must have adequate authority and experience to supervise students under their care. 	
	Activities will cease immediately if student behaviour or supervision are not appropriate.	
Accessibility	Tours of the ESWEC are suitable for those with a walking disability (i.e. requiring a wheelchair, walking frame or similar aid).	
Emergencies	In an emergency, visitors should adhere to the instructions given by Melbourne Water staff.
